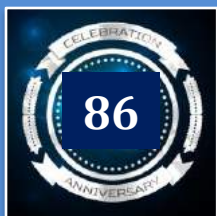

As I begin my second year as president of the Serra Club of Spokane, I am so grateful for all the wonderful faith-filled people in our Serran ministry. Your dedication and generosity are an inspiration to me, and it is truly my privilege to serve you.

My wife, Doreen, and I went to Israel along with Gerry and Sue Manfred in 2012 on a pilgrimage led by Steve Ray. We visited Caesarea Philippi which is an hour drive north of the Sea of Galilee. It was the place where

Jesus asked the disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!" Jesus replied, "Blest are you, Simon son of John! No mere man has revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. I for My part declare to you, you are 'Rock,' and upon this rock I will build my church, and the jaws of death shall not prevail against it." (Mt 16:15-18)

Peter was commissioned as our first pope. All the bishops and priests that have followed are successors to him. They were empowered by Jesus to forgive sins and perform all the sacraments. As Serrans we understand the important, indispensable role that our priests carry out in the work of the Church. Without priests there is no Church.

May Luncheon – Fr. Kevin Codd



On a beautiful spring day of May 12, 26 people attended our meeting. We had 2 guests; Joan Degroot, who was invited by Frank Heinzen and Jean Corey, who is the sister of Pat Paullin. Deacon Victor Lopez and Deacon Richard Borda were also in attendance. Deacon Borda is transferring his Serran membership to our club from North Denver.

Our speaker was Fr. Kevin Codd who retired from our diocese in 2021. He started by telling a story about seeing his cousin, Charlotte, a few years ago in Yakima. She told him that when he was young that he was identified by the larger family as the child out of 11 kids who was going to become a priest. The story

reminds him that his vocation as a gift that was given to him.

He said that he didn't want to be a Jesuit because he didn't like community life that much and that he wanted to own things. He worked as a diocesan priest in our diocese, but he had a missionary calling too. He spent a year in Guatemala which left a powerful mark on him that never left. He also was drawn into the pilgrimage trips to Santiago de Compostela. On those trips he learned to just be present to the people who show up and minister to them in that instant. Also, when he was at the Newman Center at WSU he continued to experience that people come and go from the community and that is OK. These life experiences formed him far more than the seminary.

When retirement approached, he didn't want to sit in a rocking chair. Guatemala would be too difficult at this point in his life. He thought about the Philippines but had been there a lot and wanted something different. He knew students at WSU who were from Ecuador that told him that he should come to Cuenca, Ecuador, so he considered that. He also considered more Camino trips, but the physical toll was not appealing.

He eventually began researching Cuenca on the internet. He found out there are about 8,000 North American ex-pats living there. It's cheaper, weather is moderate all year round, and its accessible because there is a lot of English spoken now. He got in touch with a person from the city and found out that when they had priests saying Mass in English, the community did OK, but otherwise it floundered. So, he decided to give Cuenca a try. He stayed 5 months beginning last Fall and they got up to having about 20 people coming to Mass every week. He is now committed for a 2-year stint and then he will again decide on the path forward. There have been some medical issues that delayed his return until January of 2023. He now has about 30 people for Sunday mass and has a Wednesday group of 12-15 people that meet for Mass, scripture study, and lunch.

Upon his return to Ecuador in June he wants to get into ministering to Ecuadorians. He may try teaching English to seminarians. He closed by inviting people to visit him in Ecuador.

June Luncheon – Mr. Rick Mclean



On June 9, 24 people attended our meeting. There were 2 guests and the speaker. Joan Degroot was invited by Frank Heinzen and Jan Provinsal was invited by Cindy Omlin. Deacon Victor Lopez led adoration.

Our speaker was Rick McLean who is the new director of Immaculate Heart Retreat Center. He introduced the new chaplain for IHRC, Fr. Max Oliva. They will have Mass Monday through Friday and on Sunday. He invited us to walk the grounds and see the improvement work they have done.

Rick encouraged us to continue our work for promoting more vocations for the priesthood. He also noted that Bishop Daly's focus on Catholic School and more seminarians is working.

He talked about his personal story of being focused on his career and business success in auto sales. He was in Grandview and thought that he should attend church to bolster his reputation. However, that experience turned around his faith life.

He expressed his appreciation for the dedication for our priests and that we need to pray for our priests. He talked about Scott Hahn's book "The Lamb's Supper" which deals with the Book of Revelations. The basis of much of the Mass can be found there.

He talked about things that are coming to IHRC as did Fr. Oliva.

He finished by telling the story of a father and the gift of pearls to his young daughter. The moral of the story is that many are holding onto the "fake" pearls of the world instead of pursuing the "real" pearls of God.

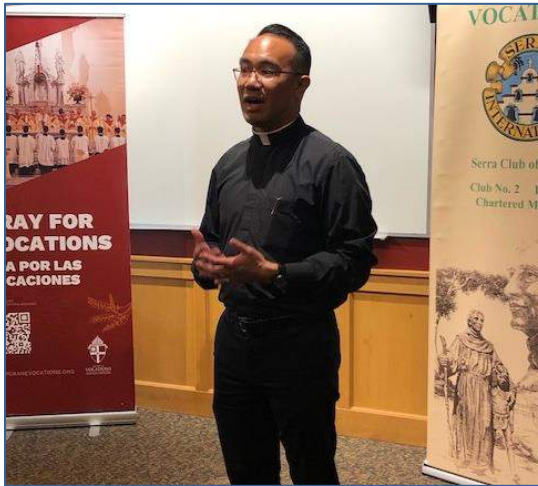
Ice Cream Social

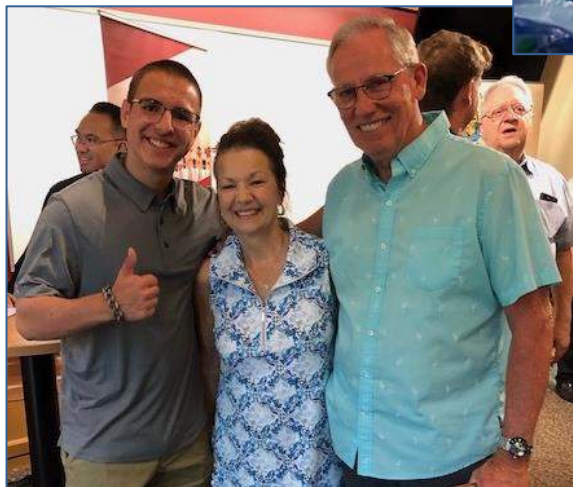

Communications

- Six newsletters were published, and the Best Regional Newsletter Award received from the United States Council of Serra.

Programs

- We participated in 12 hours of adoration at IHRC.
- We held 12 luncheon programs and membership meetings with the following speakers: *Bishop Thomas Daly, Fr. Pat Kerst, Fr. Mike Savelesky, Fr. Daniel Barnett, Fr. Andrew O'Leary, Fr. Miguel Mejia, Sr. Mary Eucharista, IHRC director Rick McLean, and our own Robert Heacock.*

Membership

- Eleven new members joined: Eva Dacanay, John Ferguson, Frank Heinzen, Mike Harrell, Sue Harrell, Maureen Kirby, Patrick Kirby, Duffy Mullen, Kirk Niblock, Cathy Niblock and Tom Wade.
- One new member transferred: Deacon Richard Borda transferred his existing Serra membership to Spokane.
- We were sorry to see three members leave us.
- Membership recruitment scripts were written and are available from the VP for Membership.
- A membership recruitment weekend was held at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Lourdes.
- A prayer request book is maintained and when a repose of the soul request is entered or made in another manner, a Mass card is sent.

Vocations

- Eight Holy Hours for Holy Vocations with receptions for seminarians and two prospective seminarian receptions were held at BWS.
- The Priests' BBQ Dinner was financially sponsored by Serrans.
- The Welcome Back Dinner for seminarians and their families was financially sponsored by Serrans as well as the set-up, food preparation, and clean up were provided by Serrans with assistance from the Serra Club of North Idaho.
- Gifts for consecrated women religious were gathered and delivered in June 2022 and May 2023.
- The Adopt-A-Seminarian program was begun and has 11 Serran adopters for nine, almost ten Spokane seminarians.
- The Seven Serrans program was reignited and has 11 Serrans praying one hour daily for our chaplain, Fr. Kyle Ratuiste.
- The Traveling Crucifix program was also reignited, and we have ten members who are serving as contact people for the grade schools.
- Birthday cards were mailed to all consecrated religious women in the diocese for whom we have birthdates and addresses.
- Ordination anniversary cards were mailed to priests ordained for the diocese for whom we have dates and addresses. Religious order priests serving in the diocese are included if we have dates and addresses.

Other

- Twelve board meetings were held.

Financial Support

- **\$2,500** to the Office of Vocations in support of Quo Vadis Days 2022 and for a dinner for parents of seminarians.
- A disbursement from our endowment of **\$1,559.65** was given to BWS for the education of seminarians in 2022 and **\$1,584.80** disbursement from our endowment will be given in September 2023.
- **\$675** was donated to the Serra endowment by members in 2022 and **\$902.50** in 2023.
- **\$500** donated to Serra by members and designated for BWS was given to BWS in 2022 and **\$625** will be given in September in 2023.

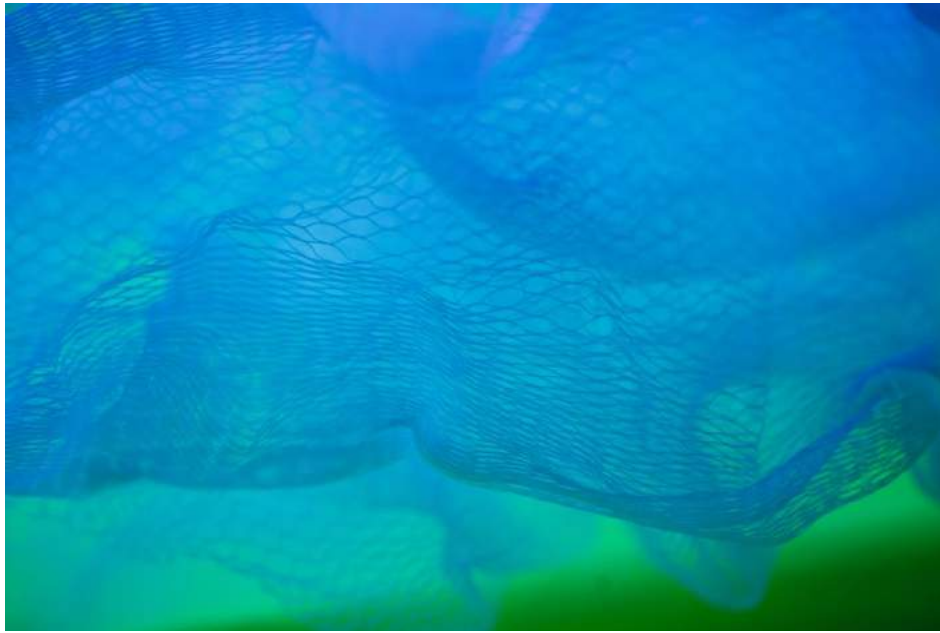
86th Anniversary Celebration Re-scheduled

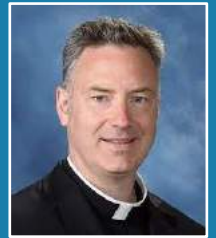

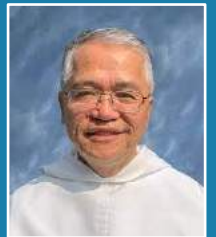
